

After School Instructor Megan Lee

Q: So, are you from the Fredericksburg area originally?

the fact that I have a big family with lots of sisters and a brother.

Q: What is one thing people might be surprised to learn about you?

A: I was a cheerleader all through high school.

A: Treat each other the way YOU want to be treated and do what you know is right.
